"My life has changed beyond all recognition since coming to Befriended. I love all the activities we go to, everyone is so kind and friendly but most of all I have so many friends now. When I used to go to town nobody would speak to me or say hello, it was so isolating. Now I meet so many people, I love it and I am so grateful to Befriended to enriching my life. I now want to give back and am befriending a lady who lives on her own who has dementia. She loves Babsie"

Ron and Margaret were lonely and isolated living in their flat in Haywards Heath. Tammy, a social prescriber from their GP surgery told them about Befriended. They rang and asked if there would be any chance of someone visiting them. Gail took the call and she happened to be doing a chaplaincy service in the home next door so said she would pop in afterwards the following day.

"We were so excited at having a visitor but did not know what to expect. It was wonderful. We shared our story and told Gail that we were Christians but could not get to church anymore. Gail listened, chatted and then prayed for us. We were full of joy and happiness. Our lives have become bareable again. Gail has visited us since and she always has time to take our calls. Befriended has become a life line".




